

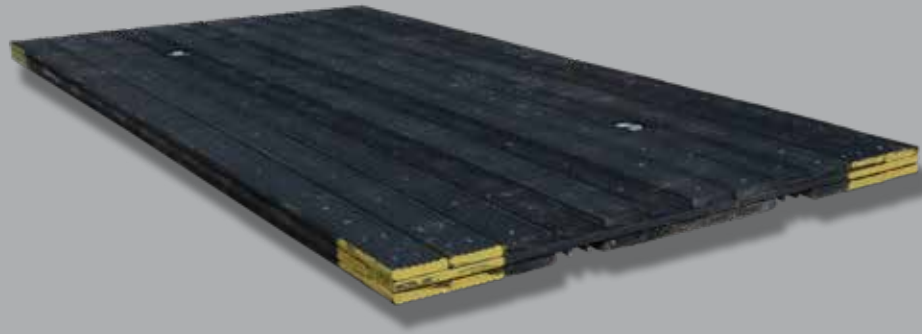

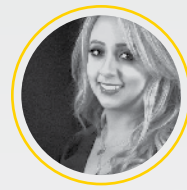

As the year draws near to an end, let us take time to reflect on our efforts and achievements in 2019. I am drawn to a quote by Thomas Jefferson, which states,

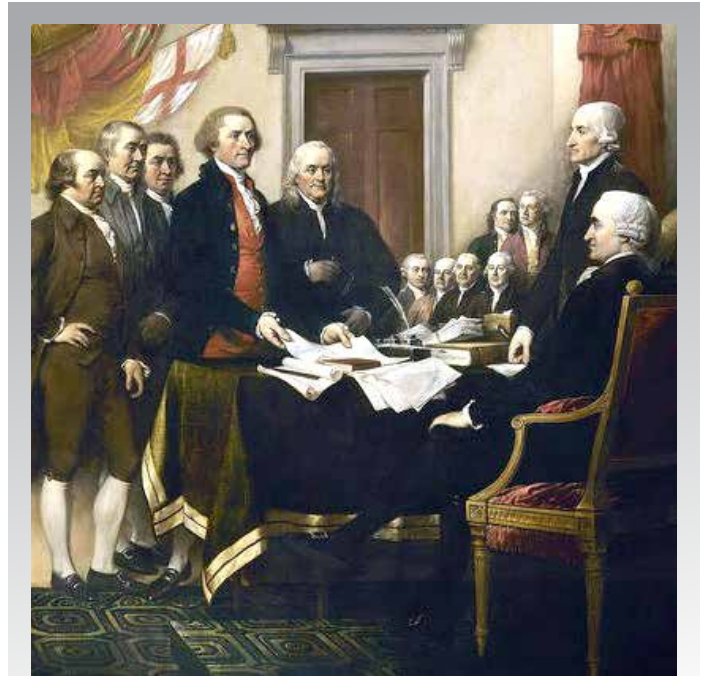

TIGER IMPROVES DRIVING RECORD

Driving remains the most dangerous activity that Tiger employees take part in. Operating on public roadways for over 6,000,000 miles in 2019 creates a significant and daily risk exposure to Tiger vehicles. The Tiger Rentals HSE Team implemented a Safe Driving Program utilizing Smith System Driver Training in June 2018. The focused execution of the Smith System by the Operations and Management teams resulted in a 54% decrease in the number of motor vehicle accidents in 2019.

“When I assumed the role as Tiger’s Corporate HSE Manager in January of 2018, my primary focus was to get the motor vehicle accident situation under control. It was costing Tiger a lot of money, damaging company vehicles and putting the lives of employees and the general public in danger. It would require a combination of training and technology to truly make a difference in positively changing the driving habits of Tiger employees. The partnership with Smith System allowed Tiger to certify two in-house instructors to deliver the message and oversee the commentary driving portion of the class. It has proven to be a game changer for Tiger’s bottom line.” Gentry Perry – Tiger Rentals Corp HSE Manager

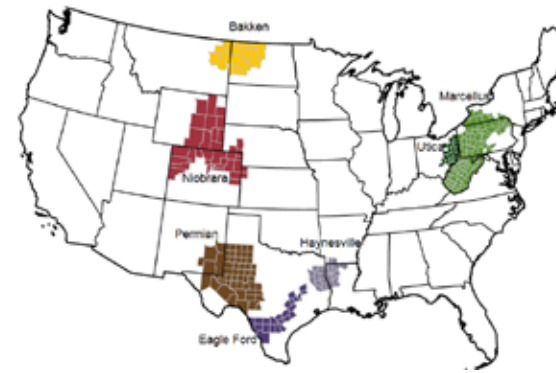
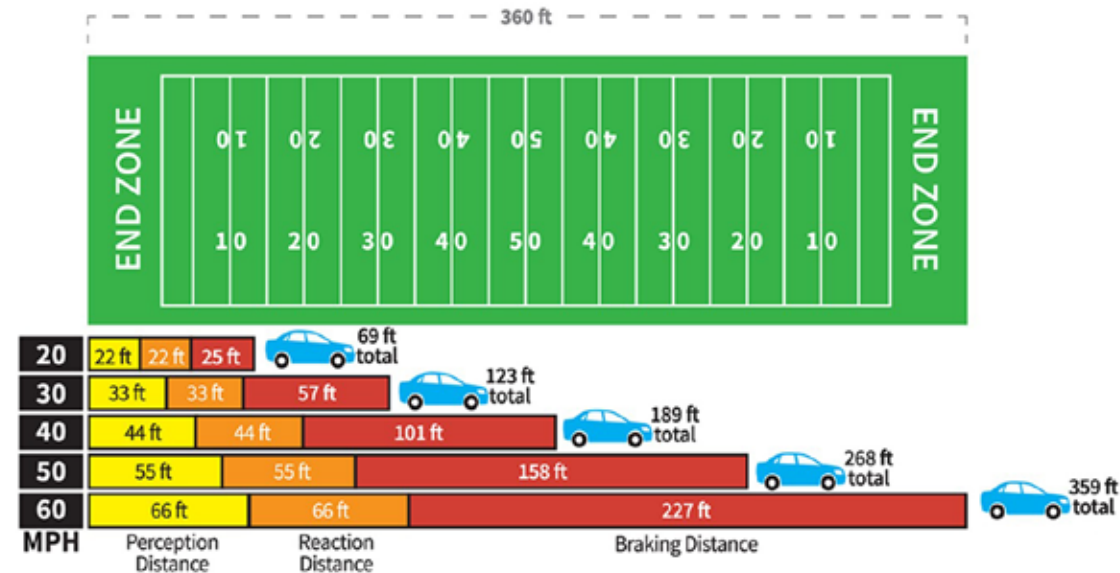
The Safe Driving Program continued to improve in 2019 when the Tiger HSE Team partnered with GeoTab by installing GO9 devices in company vehicles. The device monitors driver behavior such as speed, acceleration, and braking, provide audible driver feedback in real-time and allows for instant GPS tracking. As a result of these combined initiatives and execution of the Safe Driving Program, Tiger’s motor vehicle incident rate decreased by 89% for the second half of 2019.

“The Smith System concept is a simple, common sense approach to driving that focuses on three primary goals: Space, Visibility and Time. GeoTab driver behavior monitoring allows managers to pinpoint behaviors that need correcting and provide immediate coaching to those drivers. The combination of these systems is uncomplicated, reasonable and has proven to be highly effective for Tiger Rentals.” – Frank Allday V, Tiger Rentals HSE Supervisor

LOWER 48 INTERESTING FACTS

- The 1st Eagle Ford well was drilled in '08 with 26 drilling permits producing 358 bbls/day. In 2019, U.S. oil output from 7 major shale formations is expected to rise 58,000 bbls/day to a record 8.971 million bpd.
- The largest formation, the Permian Basin of Texas and New Mexico, is expected to add 63,000 bpd to 4.547 million bpd, the 10th consecutive increase.
- Even though the number of rigs drilling new wells in the Permian and Bakken has declined since the start of the year, output in both basins has increased as the productivity of those rigs reached record levels.
- South Texas oil production is expected to increase until 2021. The Austin Chalk will become a hotter geological formation for drilling post-2021 than the Eagle Ford Shale, the EIS predicts.

STRATEGIC GULF COAST EXPANSION

TIGER IS TAKING GROUND IN CORPUS CHRISTI

The Port of Corpus Christi is getting ready to take on a new influx of Permian crude oil with the high-capacity crude pipeline projects underway. Additionally, the Corpus Christi Stage 3 Project is started and expected to produce approximately 10 million tonnes per annum of LNG. A fractionation unit that will produce fuel gas as well as stabilized naphtha and ultra-low-sulfur diesel for the Eagle Ford, Wolfcamp, Permian Basin and Gulf of Mexico shale plays is progressing with construction as well. If that isn't enough, a joint venture is starting construction on a \$10B ethane cracker plant in Corpus. These developments could lead to big opportunities for Tiger.

With all of this exciting news in the works, Tiger Industrial Rentals is making aggressive moves to secure a contract for 4 acres in Corpus Christi, Texas. The new facility will fall under Wayne LeJune's (South Texas Manager) division. Lupe Caballero, Corpus Christi Sales, will be pivotal in helping to get the new facility up and running with a ready line stocked full of pumps, mats, blast resistant buildings, generators, light towers and more.

“We are excited to move forward in securing a contract for land in Corpus Christi to fully dedicate our services to existing clients and those that are moving into the region. It is a critical milestone on the path to a positive future for Tiger,” said Stephen Mouton, Tiger Industrial's General Manager. “Our continued progress in South Texas is a testament to my team's dedication and perseverance for success and reinforces our vision to expand our world-class equipment and services into untapped markets.”

TIGER GETS A HOLE IN ONE WHEN TOP GOLF MOVES TO THE BEAUMONT AREA

Tiger Industrial supplied and laid mats for the new 5 Under Golf Center and Top Golf Swing Suites in Beaumont. The job initially called for 12,800 sq ft of mats equating to 100 Tiger Laminate Mats. The mats were needed for the construction company to work on the freshly laid limestone base with their large cranes in order to set the net poles and move other construction equipment.

The day before the mats were to be laid, the area needing to be covered grew to 28,000 sq ft of mats equating to 219 Tiger Laminate Mats. In order to ensure there was enough mats for the job, Tiger Industrial sent an additional 21 mats bringing the total to 240 Tiger Laminate Mats. The actual job started on a Friday and the Tiger team worked through the day starting at 7:00 AM and ending at 6:00 PM. Tiger's team worked Saturday from 7:00 AM until they laid the last mat at 4:00 PM that day. The customers were impressed with the precision, timeliness and overall effort by Tiger Industrial. Five days after the job was complete Tiger Industrial received a call for an additional 30 mats bringing the job total to 270 Tiger Laminate Mats.



TIGER BATON ROUGE TO THE RESCUE FOR AN EMERGENCY PUMP JOB!

When the term "make it happen" is put to the test, our Tiger Industrial Baton Rouge team does not disappoint. The crew recently came to the rescue for a client in the Port Allen, Louisiana area when the client called with an emergency for some pumps. "We got the call around 9:15 AM. The customer was trying to bypass a creek for a pipeline dig and inspection but the 2 pumps they had from a competitor weren't doing the job by themselves," said Zack Hamilton.

Joe Chaisson and his team determined flow and total dynamic head, based on the conversation and selected the right pumps for the project. Two 6NNT Pumps with hoses and berms were needed to get the job done right. The customer sent one of his guys to pick up the pumps and rented an additional 7kW LED Light Tower and a 528 Gallon Fuel Cube on site! "Joe and I followed behind with the light tower. When we got to the job-site, we helped their crew unload the equipment, roll out hoses, and set up the pumps. The client was pumping and bypassing the creek successfully by 12:30 pm," said Zack. "I went out there again on Saturday to check on the equipment and help hook up the fuel cube pump. Everyone was very impressed with, not only our equipment, but the quality and timeliness of the service as well; we have already put in multiple quotes for them for jobs they have coming up in the future since this order," Zack happily exclaimed.

Talk about prompt and efficient service! Within 3 hours, the team solved the problem, took the order, delivered the equipment and set it up at a location that was about 45 minutes drive. Now, that's the way to make it happen!

GULF OF MEXICO INTERESTING FACTS

- The state of Louisiana issued its first offshore oil and gas lease in 1936, and the following year the Pure Oil Company discovered the first Louisiana offshore oil field, the Creole Field, 1.2 miles (1.9 from the shore of Cameron Parish, from a platform built on timber pilings in 10-to-15-foot-deep water.
- The first offshore well in Texas was drilled in 1938, but the first oil discovery was not made until 1941, off Jefferson County.
- The U.S. Gulf of Mexico is expected to set another oil production record in 2020 with most of the growth coming from deepwater projects, according to a new study.
- Average production next year is expected to exceed 1.9 million barrels a day, according to the Norwegian-based energy research and consulting firm Rystad Energy

These are standard units pictured on a 310' class Chouest OSV. They're looking at the 2 - 3 ft of unused bull works that's not being loaded. In the meantime, the client is making due with all (12) units on rent. Hope to hear back from our new Logistics Manager soon to discuss options.

TIGER SAFETY EYEING MEXICO

& PMI GETTING ITS GROOVE ON

Tiger Safety blew through the summer including an all-time revenue record in August due to growth in GOM work, Safety Technician Services and high utilization of CPT rentals. David Lacombe and Matt Hebert have done a great job increasing the customer base of safety services in the GOM out of Broussard this year with our average number of customers per month expanding by over 30%. Broussard is ready to give their H₂S Services a shot in Mexico this coming year as activity heats up across the border.

Safety Technician Services has developed our most diverse customer base servicing Pipeline, Drilling, Offshore, P&A, Cavern Storage, Construction and LNG Construction projects. Bobby Pagitt and Kelly Marceaux have done a fine job developing this service and are set for a great upcoming year.

CPT rentals continue to account for half of Tiger Safety's revenue and Kym Nino has her finger firmly on the customer's pulse. Casey Ardoin stated "The oilfield is predictably dramatic. It reacts to any and everything." The CPT group will continue to spread out equipment through the mid-continent with Curt Deshotel pushing hard in Colorado and North Dakota.

Brandon Chaumont has done a great job managing both the Dilley and Midland stores along with his Service Line

Managers Joel Wirtz, Billy Gunnels, Stevie Mouton and Jennifer Jimenez.

PMI has gotten their groove back with core services increasing market share and focusing on being first in class earning an 18% overall billings increase over last year. Richie Guillory has increased the dockside automated boat cleaning by an impressive 44% this year with room to expand this coming year. Although the number of offshore rigs and boats servicing the rigs has remained flat throughout the year, PMI's efficiency and quality has earned Richie's team a bigger piece of the pie. Offshore cleaning increased 21% this year and shows great promise for 2020. Joey Templet and the Solid Control Group will have several jobs underway in December and will continue through the first quarter of next year. Don Mehrtens stated, "I feel we have the right talent in the right place now and we have gotten rid of the services that we weren't in a position to win. We are putting all of our energy on winning services and it's starting to give us the results we were looking for."

Jerry Crow has taken on a special projects position to enhance the larger more complicated projects including offshore and onshore. Ronnie Morgel and Grant Boutte have taken on the challenge of growing the Offshore Services Group.

PMI enters 2020 with momentum.



PMI COMPLETES 15 MONTH PROJECT DECOMMISSIONING & NORM REMEDIATION

Congrats to our Louisiana Environmental Services Division for the successful completion of a large-scale project for a major energy corporation. This project has been on PMI's radar for over 5 years as it was literally in our own backyard here in Morgan City. After 40+ years, the client has discontinued operations of its Morgan City shore-base facility. PMI won the bid to bring the property back to an environmentally clean standard as required by the landowner.

PMI was tasked with two phases to the project - demolition and remediation. The demolition phase began in the fall of 2018. It consisted of bringing down over 6 large buildings all with asbestos and lead paint issues. In addition to the buildings, PMI also removed numerous concrete slabs and a seaplane access site.

In 2019, the remediation of the 46-acre facility consisted of removing contaminated soil, primarily NORM (Naturally Occurring Radioactive Material) using a "surgical approach," in order to reduce cost for our customer. PMI removed over 2500 cu yds of NORM contaminated soil.

This project was considered a high-profile job in terms of our customer, the landowner, and the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ). The DEQ

is the regulatory agency in charge of releasing NORM contaminated sites for future use. At the conclusion of the project, Mr. Ziad Fahd with DEQ not only commended PMI on our performance to our client, but insisted the company recognize PMI for our stellar work performance.

The PMI crews were led by Operations Manager, Donald Marin and Senior Project Managers, John Tweedel and Brent Mayeux. The best practices, PMI employed on this project, were shared globally within the clients organization and the crew was recognized and commended by the clients.

For both phases of the project, PMI had as many as 15 employees working on this site, representing multiple PMI service lines. PMI logged 11,326 man-hours, all without an injury or serious incidents.

This project will prove to be a springboard for many other projects that this client has in its queue. The company is in the process of promoting PMI to a Mob 2 Level, meaning more future work on large environmental projects.

MEXICO INTERESTING FACTS

- Mexico is one of the largest oil producers in the world (1.8 million barrels per day in 2018), and the fourth-largest in the Americas after the United States, Canada, and Brazil.
- Since peaking in 2004, Mexico's oil production has been sliced in half to below 2 million b/d. Although nearly 45% back then, oil revenues still account for 20-25% of the federal budget. Amid plummeting production, the country has been very lucky that domestic demand has remained surprisingly flat, thanks to a successful gas displacing fuel oil program in the power

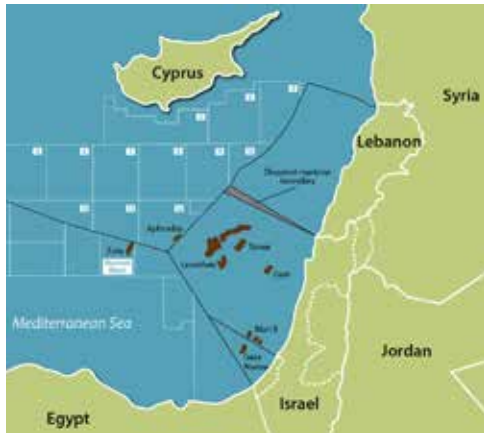

MEDITERRANEAN INTERESTING FACTS

- The Lebanese basin is surrounded by proven hydrocarbon discoveries to the west & south, including the offshore gas fields Tamar, Leviathan, Aphrodite, Zohr, Calypso, Glaucus, and many others onshore to the east in the Palmyrides. Lebanon is on the Levant Basin in the eastern Mediterranean where a number of big sub-sea gas fields have been discovered since 2009 in Cypriot, Israeli and Egyptian waters.
- In 1999, Noble Energy made its first gas discovery in Israel. The company has found more than 30 trillion cubic feet of gas over the last decade. Some experts say new discoveries could double that. Last year Noble and the Israeli company Delek Drilling signed a 10-year deal to deliver gas to Egypt by pipeline beginning later this year. Some of that fuel may be re-exported from two Egyptian terminals.
- Israel could seek to sell gas to Asia, where demand is growing, but public opposition has blocked plans for an export terminal on the small, densely populated shoreline.

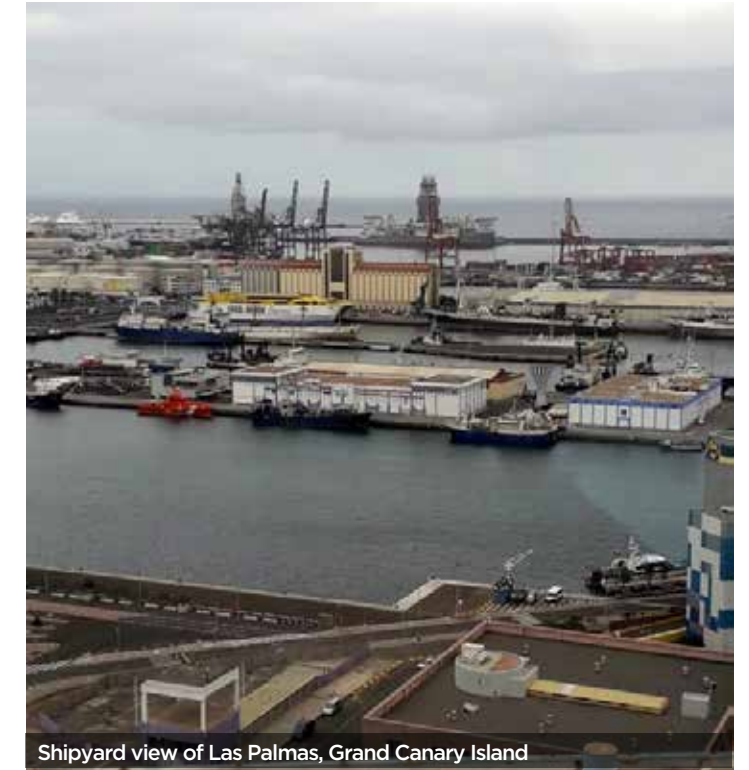

LATIN AMERICA INTERESTING FACTS

- Brazil produced an average of 2.68 million bopd in 2018. With 13.4 billion barrels of proven oil reserves at the end of 2018 – the second-largest oil reserves in South America after Venezuela – the country's R/P ratio stands at 13.7 years. More than 94% of those oil reserves are located offshore. According to the National Agency of Petroleum, Natural Gas and Biofuels, known as the ANP, the country could bring its oil production to more than 5 million bopd by 2027.
- Production increases in the coming years will be propelled by the deployment of drilling vessels, production platforms, and FPSOs deployed to the rich Santos pre-salt fields, but recent and future pre-salt auctions will drive Brazil toward the top ranks of oil and gas producers during the next decade.

AFRICA INTERESTING FACTS

- Due to the discovery of over 180 tcf of natural gas reserves in the Rovuma basin by Texas-based Anadarko (Area 1) and Italian firm ENI (Area 4), Mozambique is expected to become a major exporter by 2023.
- Mozambique's current natural gas production is operated by Sasol (South Africa) in Inhambane Province, which holds proven reserves of 2.6 trillion cubic feet (TCF). The natural gas is produced and processed at a central facility in Temane and then transported via an 865 km pipeline to South Africa, with a link to southern Mozambique for domestic use.
- For the next five years, opportunities for U.S. equipment suppliers will be driven by the construction of Anadarko's LNG plant, ENI's FLNG plant, and ExxonMobil's LNG plant.

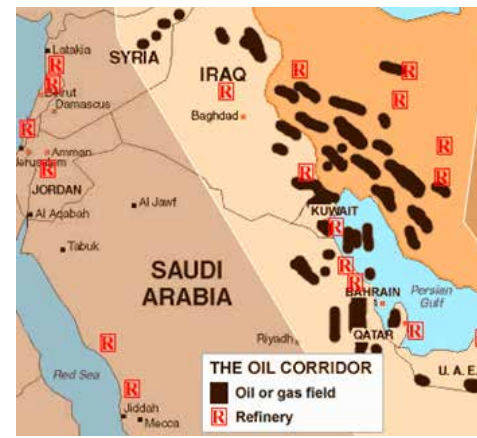

- The Middle East includes five of the top ten oil-producing countries and is responsible for producing about 30% of world production. While state-owned enterprises produce much of the oil, many international oil companies engage in oil production and related activities in the Middle East through joint ventures, production-sharing agreements, and other business models.

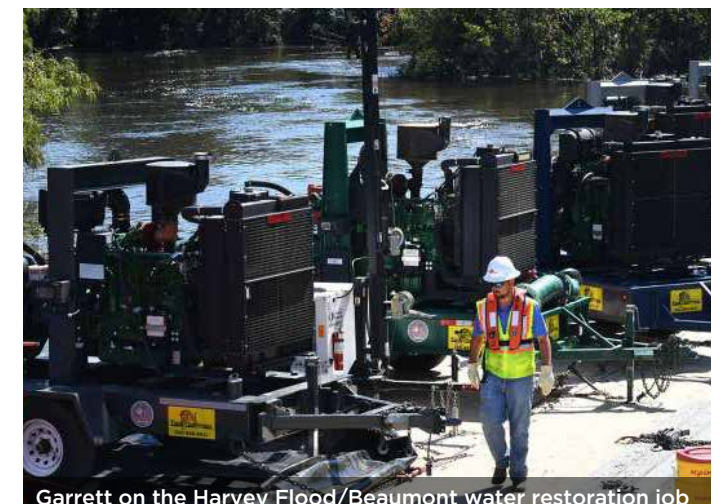

There are currently 2,100 pieces of tagged equipment in Tiger Industrial's fleet, and that number is growing daily. Garrett also worked closely with the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles in order to get approval for all of Tiger's pumps, generators and light towers tagged with machinery plates instead of trailer plates, saving the company an estimated \$150,000 dollars yearly. Most recently, Garrett has worked

with our HSE Management team to implement the new GeoTab vehicle tracking software installed on the Tiger truck fleet. The GeoTab program takes an active approach to coach drivers and ensure they are operating company vehicles safely. More importantly the GeoTab program allows Tiger Industrial to become more efficient in dispatching technicians for service calls based on their location.

The Tiger Safety Well Testing Service Line or CPT Services has grown from a humble fleet of 25 conventional sand traps rented to well testers in the Haynesville Shale to over 450 large pieces servicing all shale plays in the US.

Casey says he's turned his challenge of not being a people person into one of his best attributes and says he loves working with his customers and solving their problems. Casey is quick to give Kym Nino credit for growing the division and admits that he has enjoyed their relationship the most during the building of the CPT Service. Casey also gives credit to Curt Deshotel, "He's a natural," Casey smirks, when describing Curt's salesmanship. Casey also proudly credits Corey Vice, Morgan Heinen, Sherry Grossie, Tyler Garber, Brandon Chaumont, Stevie Mouton, Eddy Boudreaux and all the CPT workers with the CPT Service success.

Richie began his 2nd tenure with PMI in May 2014 as a Facility Manager at our Fourchon, LA dockside cleaning location sharing the manager's position with a counterpart. By the end of 2014, he was re-assigned as the full-time Facility Manager. Anyone who knows our Fourchon operation knows that any schedule is solely for organizational purposes though he tries to adhere as close as possible to a 5 & 2 work week. Richie states, "Returning to PMI after having worked here previously was an easy decision. Working for upper management I could trust and count on made it easy."

Since rejoining our team, Richie has transformed PMI's Fourchon operations from being able to simultaneously clean two liquid mud tanks (LMT) on two separate offshore supply vessels (OSV) with approximately 30 on-duty personnel to up to four LMTs simultaneously on three separate OSVs with approximately 40 on-duty personnel. As a result of this capability, billings in Fourchon have increased by 60%. Even with additional, more efficient equipment, that's a remarkable 300% increase in activity with only a 33% increase in the number of personnel executing the work. In today's oil & gas industry, that is truly "doing more with less!"

Over the course of his current 5+ years span since returning to PMI, Richie has driven multiple process improvements in PMI's MudHog cleaning process. Each has resulted in improved safety for our co-workers and/or efficiencies that

reduce waste streams and downtime of our customers' assets – OSV. By decreasing downtime of OSVs for one customer, it opens the opportunity for PMI to accept work from other customers that might otherwise be lost.

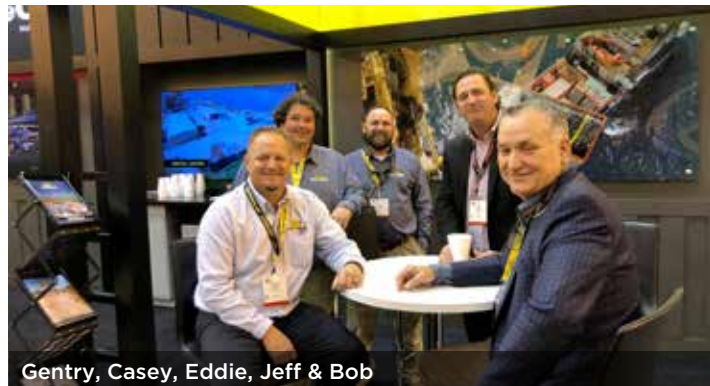

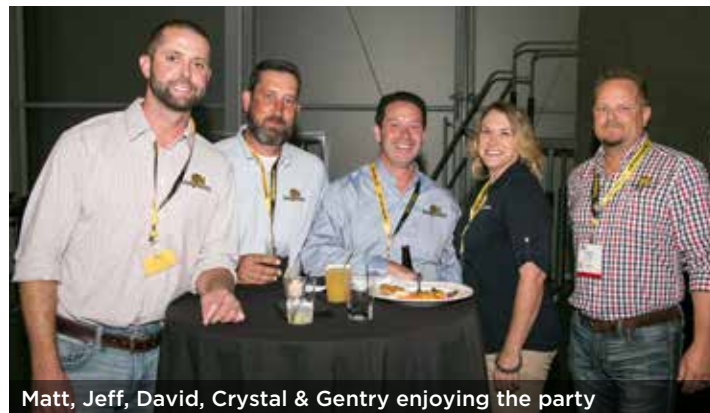

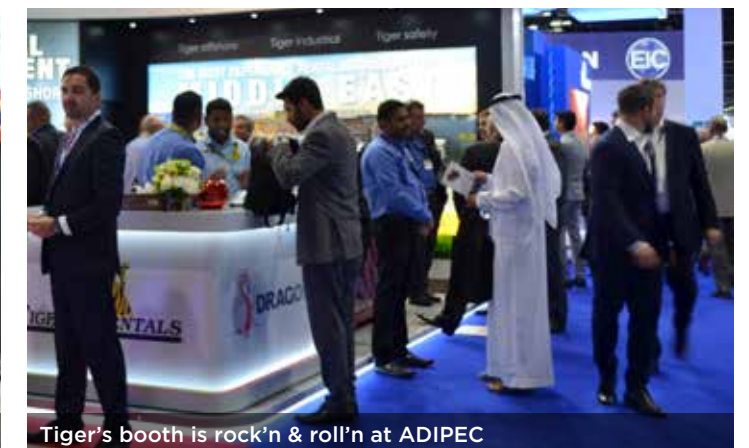

Directions

- 12 Large Glazed Cinnamon Rolls
- 3 Large Eggs
- 1 Qt. Heavy Cream
- 1 Pinch Salt
- 1 Tsp. Cinnamon

Cut rolls into pieces or pull apart. Combine beaten eggs, heavy cream, salt, cinnamon and pour over rolls. Make sure rolls absorb liquids. Bake at 350° open for 20 minutes then cover and bake at 325° for 15 to 20 minutes or until cooked in the center.

Fosters Topping

- 1 Stick Butter
- 2 Cups Light Brown Sugar
- ¼ Cup Meyers Rum

Melt butter, add brown sugar, cook until it looks like caramel. Turn stove off and add Meyers Rum, then pour over the cooked bread pudding while it's hot.
